Explanations:

- Numbers of coins concern AR tetradrachmas, if not otherwise specified (DR for drachmas and AE for the bronze coins).
- Types of the barbarian coinages are inside the quotation marks. The unclassifiable imitations of Philip II’s, Alexander III’s and others’ tetradrachmas are quoted as “Ph. II”, “Al. III”, etc.
- An unknown quantity is denoted with a question mark (?). None of the hoards is entirely preserved.
- Lifetime issue is denoted as LT. Posthumous issue is denoted as PH.
